

A History of Askland

odern Ashland is commonly pictured as a place of beautiful landscapes, with rolling hills, rivers, fields, sunsets, and hot air balloons. Yet, how did the peaceful serenity of the colors, floating amid blue skies on morning and evenings rich with dew, first come to be a staple of our historical community?

In the 1960s, Ashland wanted to celebrate its status as balloon capital of the world – a name they earned because in those days 70 percent of the world's toy balloons were manufactured in Ashland, Ohio — with a Balloon Festival.

The first Balloon Festival took place in 1963, complete with balloon parades, a carnival, and a balloon queen pageant. That year, Susan Roberts reigned as Ashland Balloon Queen and also represented Ashland in the Miss Ohio pageant.

A number of other activities at the event celebrated toy balloons and their production, but the one that inspired the current festival was the hot air balloon ascension from Brookside Park.

The balloon lifted off with six people, but only went about a quarter of a mile because the weather was not conducive to flying. Another balloon festival took place the next year, and then, the festival was incorporated into the sesquicentennial celebration of 1965.

In 1990, the idea of hot air balloons was brought back to Ashland during the city's 175th anniversary as an ode to the events in the '60s. About 19-20 balloons were brought in for a one-day festival that had beautiful weather. Residents of Ashland enjoyed the event and asked for it back for an entire weekend.

According to John Sidle, who has been associated in some way with BalloonFest since its inception, organizers in the early years started to look at what other events were already taking place in the community, such as Brookside Golf's Red, White, and Blue Scramble and the Ashland Historical Society's Ice Cream Social, in order to incorporate them. In 1993, it went to a three-day event, and then a fourth was added, which has served as a day for media flights, fund-raisers like the Hawkins BBQ, and public tethered rides.

According to almost everyone ever involved in the event, including the festival's founders, BalloonFest is held every year on the Fourth of July weekend because it is a patriotic holiday, a time for celebration of community and family, and it keeps people local while also bringing in tourists. In 1992, there were 2,000 spectators for the balloon launch. Mass lift-offs, entertainment for adults and children, and other area activities were all added to improve the event. Balloon Glows were added in 2001 and the crowd numbers rose to even greater heights.

In 2002, Ashland BalloonFest was incorporated and handed

over from the Ashland Area Chamber of Commerce to the BalloonFest Board of Trustees, with Rick Spreng as President. The group hoped to bring the event back to basics: a focus on pilots and the balloons.

"Never in our wildest dreams, as we met with balloon pilots Don Hamilton and Alex Jonard about what they could do for our event in 1990, did we think it would last beyond that first mass lift off, let alone 25 years later stronger than ever before," said Spreng, one of the coordinators of Ashland's 175th celebration and then Ashland BalloonFest, who went on to serve as board chairman and volunteer for many years. "That first meeting.....was the night of my first balloon ride. We took off from Freer Field and Don and Alex thought it was ideal. The next year we gave it a name, Ashland Balloonfest, secured funding, and the rest as they say, is history."

The late pilot Bob Zanella, one of the nation's premier balloon pilots to be licensed in the 1970s, came in to offer his help during that 1990 event, too. He went on to serve in many capacities, including balloonmeister, until his death in 2010 at the age of 80. He was a mentor to many pilots everywhere, but especially enjoyed Ashland. He was quoted as saying that he enjoyed Ashland BalloonFest because of the local business support.

Zanella noted in newspaper interviews that pilots love the Ashland community and love flying there as it doesn't have many prohibited zones for landing. This is great in regards to safety. People in the Ashland community seem to generally love chasing the balloons, having them land in their fields and yards all over Ashland County, and even helping the pilots or in serving as crew.

Other balloonmeisters have been Hamilton, Jonard, Maury Sullivan, and Rick Kohut who also have been longtime pilots and supporters. Hamilton, who was tasked with organizing and participating in the 175th balloon race and was affiliated until 2009, will serve as balloonmeister for the 25th birthday race. Pilots who have flown all 25 years are Jonard and Michael Emich.

There have always been over 20 to 30 balloons participating, with the record being 39 balloons in 2005, depending on pilot schedules and sponsorships available. In the past, there have been many shaped balloons such as a Santa Claus, Red Dragon, the Purple People Eater, various Pepsi product cans, a large-sized American flag, a pink monster truck, Gordo the Monkey, and even a man who

was garnering national press who flew over on a cluster of helium balloons!

For the first time in what had been a very long time, the weather was nice enough to get all six flights up in 2010. Also, longtime fan favorite balloon Patches was donated to Ashland BalloonFest by owner and pilot John Gill. It was one of the very first balloons flown in Ashland. Gill was the first pilot safety officer and will serve as safety officer again in 2015.

Many of the initial coordinators are proud to see that the event is still going strong today. Now, people flock in from all over and there are many more volunteers. Sidle said, "No matter how much work goes into the event each year, we always find a way to have fun. Being involved, you get the feeling of doing something important for the community."

Over the course of 25 years there have been all sorts of activities added, such children's games and parade, musical entertainment, field activities, sporting events, food vendors, and more. The organizers have always been open to new ideas and strive to make ABF better every year. Current President Mindi Cantrell would like to see "continued community support through both sponsorships and public participation."

Misty Miller, Public Relations Chair of ABF, said, "Every year, good or bad weather, when you look out at the crowds knowing you had a small part in their holiday weekend, it gives you goosebumps."

It looks like Ashland BalloonFest might be celebrating 25 years, but the tradition of balloons in Ashland has been around for so many more. With the community behind it, and it in the hands of so many dedicated volunteers giving numerous hours of service, the future looks bright for it to soar well into the future.

"Weather" to Fly or Not to Fly

2015 BALLOON COMPETITION OFFICIALS

This year's balloon officials were all pilots or crewed the Balloon Race in 1990 as part of the 175th Celebration, and for many years after. The Ashland BalloonFest Committee is honored to have these gentlemen join us for our 25th Birthday Celebration.

The Balloonmeister is the head balloonist or competition director. His job is to direct the pilots to safe and successful flights. He leads the pilots in briefings before each flight, advising them of the conditions they will face flying and of any potential obstacles they may face. The Balloonmeister has a team of advisors, who work with him to make the best decisions they can on topics like weather conditions and landowner issues. If conditions are not safe to fly, he makes the decision to cancel the flight. You can imagine the pressure when 28 pilots are sitting there ready for you to give them the word to fly, as well as an anxiously awaiting crowd of up to 20,000 ready to cheer them on. The Balloonmeister and his team's number one priority is safety. The Balloonmeister, Weather Officer, and Safety Officer look at wind, winds aloft, visibility, rain, storms and temperature to determine "weather" to fly or not to fly.

WIND

Words to look for in a forecast within a 100 mile radius: *gusty, breezy, windy, blustery, small craft warnings, high wind warnings*

Wind is the most critical factor in safe ballooning; it affects every phase of a flight. More balloon flights are cancelled due to wind than for any other reason. Balloons fly best in light and stable winds of 4-6 miles per hour. Maximum safe winds are 8-10 mph.

WINDS ALOFT

The winds on the surface are just one of the concerns. They have to think three dimensionally and consider what the wind is doing at different altitudes as well. This is perhaps the most confusing aspect for passengers and spectators. For example, there is not even a hint of a breeze on the ground and the flight has just been cancelled due to wind, how come? They look at winds at the surface (the wind you can feel) and the winds at 1 to 9,000 feet. They are not going to 9,000 feet, but it tells them if they might encounter issues such as wind shear, turbulence, or strong surface winds later on. Even if there are no winds to speak of at the surface, the winds aloft may drive the decision not to fly. Winds aloft of 18-20 knots or 20 miles per hour will be sufficient to cancel a flight.

POOR VISIBILITY

Words to look for in a forecast within a 100 mile radius: foggy, hazy, misty

How far can we see? Hot air balloon aircrafts are designated by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) as Visual Flight Rules (VFR) certified. That means they must have a certain amount of visibility to fly legally. The visibility must be 1 to 3 miles, depending on where they are flying. If they don't have it, they can't fly!

RAIN & STORMS

Words to look for in a forecast within a 100 mile radius: thunderstorms, rain, chance of showers or storms

The decision not to fly in rain or storms seems a simple one - of course they don't! What isn't so simple is why the flight may be cancelled when no storm or rain actually happens in the area. Storms can be significant events to any type of aircraft, but a balloon is perhaps the most weather sensitive aircraft there is. An airplane can turn and run from a storm whereas a balloon is drawn into a storm. The winds will accelerate and head toward a building storm and flow out of a decaying storm. These gust fronts can occur 75 to 100 miles away from the actual storm and create winds that are dangerous to a balloon. Once again, it's the wind! If storms are forecast or there are storms within 100 miles they will cancel flights.

TEMPERATURE

Since hot air balloons fly by changing the temperature inside the balloon with heat, it stands to reason that outside air temperature is going to affect balloon flights, and it does! When the air in the balloon is heated, it becomes hotter and thus less dense than the surrounding outside air. This hotter air is "lighter" and the balloon will float upward. The more heat, the higher up you go. A balloon will fly when its temperature is around 140 degrees above the outside air temperature (generally). So, the colder it is outside, the less heat it takes to fly and conversely, the hotter it is outside, the more heat it will take to fly. Can't wrap your head around this? Here is an example:

Outside Air Temperature + Heat it Takes to Fly (140 F) = Temperature Inside the Balloon

Cold day of 30 degrees F + 140 F = 170 degrees

Hot day of 95 degrees F + 140 F = 235 degrees (more heat if it's hot out)

This is of particular concern to pilots operating smaller balloons. The smaller the balloon, the less lift capacity it will have and the hotter it must be inside the balloon for it to fly. The maximum continuous operating temperature for most hot air balloons is 250 degrees Fahrenheit. That leaves little margin for safety and for maneuvering on a very hot day.

Look for the colored flag near the pilots' tent, east of the Main Stage, to find out status of current flight.

Flags will be raised following pilots' briefing which starts approximately 30 minutes before each flight or glow.



No inflation or take-off permitted. Previous permission to take-off cancelled.



General permission to all balloons to begin hot inflation.



Permission to 'blue' wave (odd numbered balloons) to begin hot inflation.



Permission to 'white' wave (even numbered balloons) to begin hot inflation.






